<u>Five Little Ducks</u> by Raffi. The words from the song (above) in a book with illustrations. And <u>Ten Rubber Duckies</u> by William Winburn. These are both countdown songs/stories, and they have a really memorable, predictable rhyme and rhythm – easy for kids to memorize!

• Sing the song, and act it out with rubber ducks or handmade puppets. Great for learning to subtract and learning about zero.

One Duck Stuck by Phyllis Root. Fabulous rhyming, rhythmic words. And a counting book. And lots of fun marshland creatures.

 Sensory play in muddy muck: give child a bag of dirt (or collect dirt from yard). Spend time exploring the dirt, describing it, looking at it through a magnifying glass. Add a little water. Explore some more. Then add more water till you've got gooey mud. Get a toy duck stuck.

<u>Ten Little Rubber Ducks</u> by Eric Carle. Based on a real-life story of a shipping carton of rubber ducks that fell into the ocean.

- Numbers: Collect 10 rubber ducks, or use paper ducks. Child rolls dice, counts the dots, puts that many ducks in the tub to show "how many fell into the ocean?"
- Talk about ordinal numbers & directions: the first duck swam north, the second duck...
